# Capacity Building Program for Indigenous Peoples and Other Forest Dwellers, and Southern CSOs

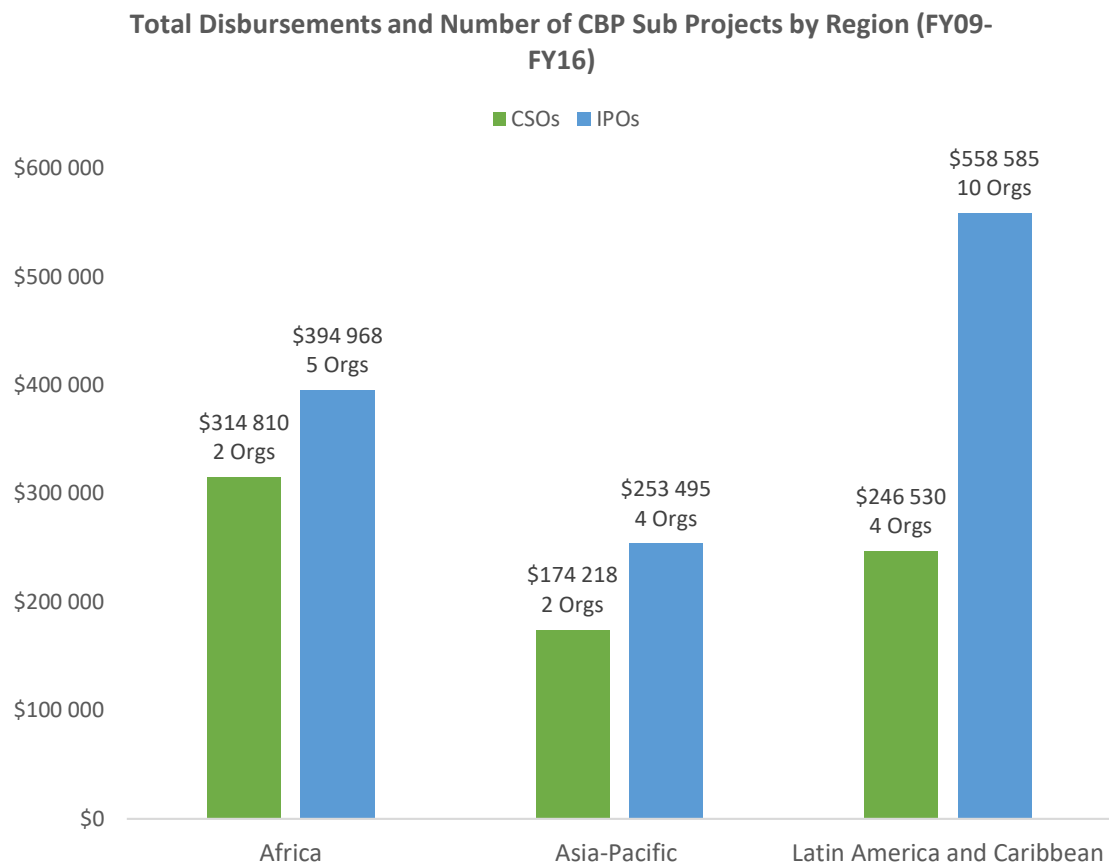
The FCPF Capacity Building Program for Forest-Dependent Peoples and Southern Civil Society Organizations works with Indigenous Peoples, other forest-dependent communities, and southern civil society organizations to increase their understanding of REDD+ and their engagement in REDD+ Readiness and implementation.

The CBP focuses on national capacity building and awareness raising, especially among women and youth, as well as regional exchange and sharing of lessons learned. Launched in 2008, the small grants component of the CBP in its three phases now totals just under \$10 million.



# Phase 1 of the Capacity Building Program 2009-2016

About \$1.9 million in funding supported 27 projects across the three regions in 21 countries

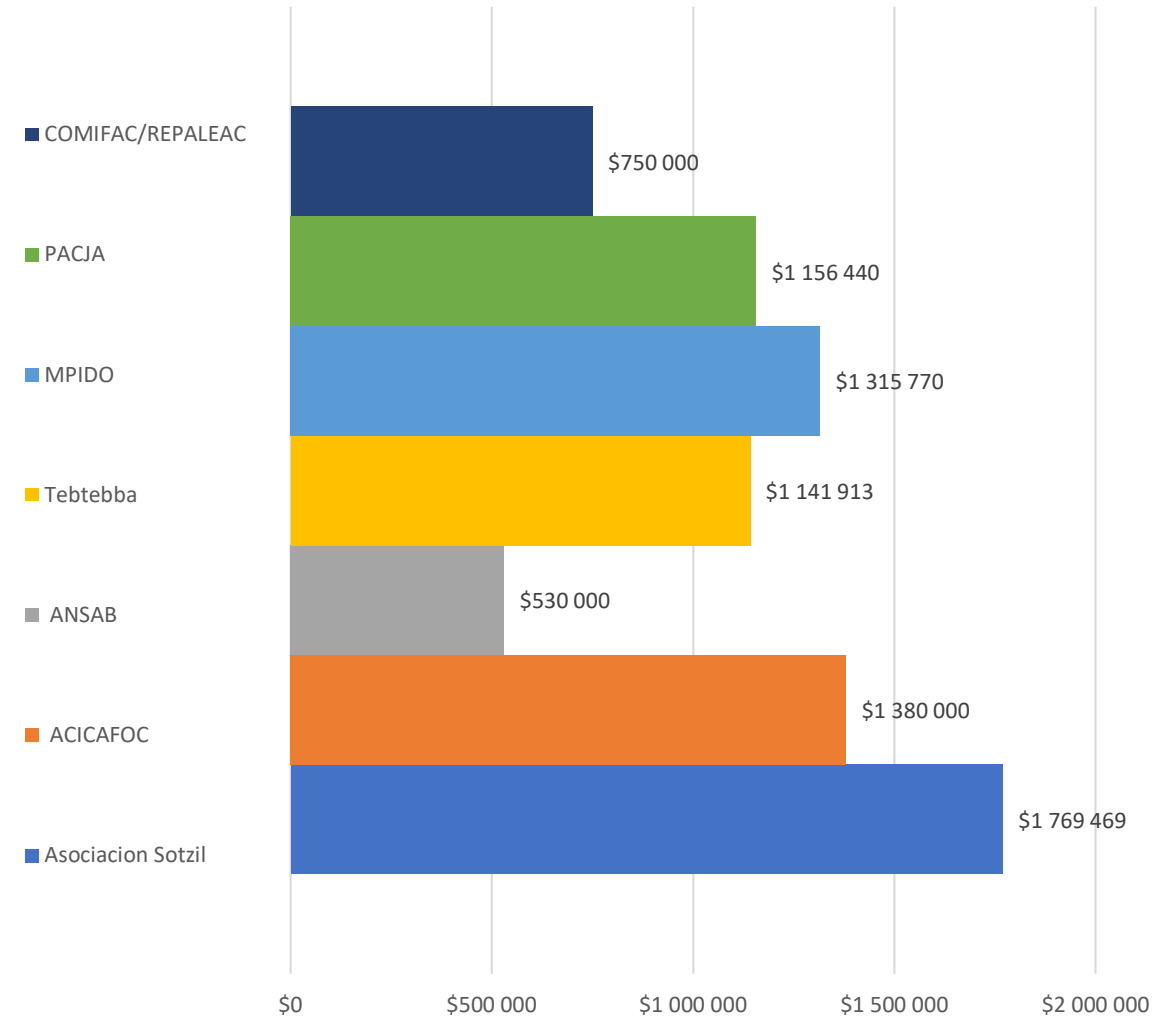

# Phase 2 and additional financing (2016- June 2020)

With approximately \$8 million in funding support to Phase 2 supported seven regional organizations, one for indigenous peoples and one for civil society organizations across the three regions, with one additional in Francophone Africa.

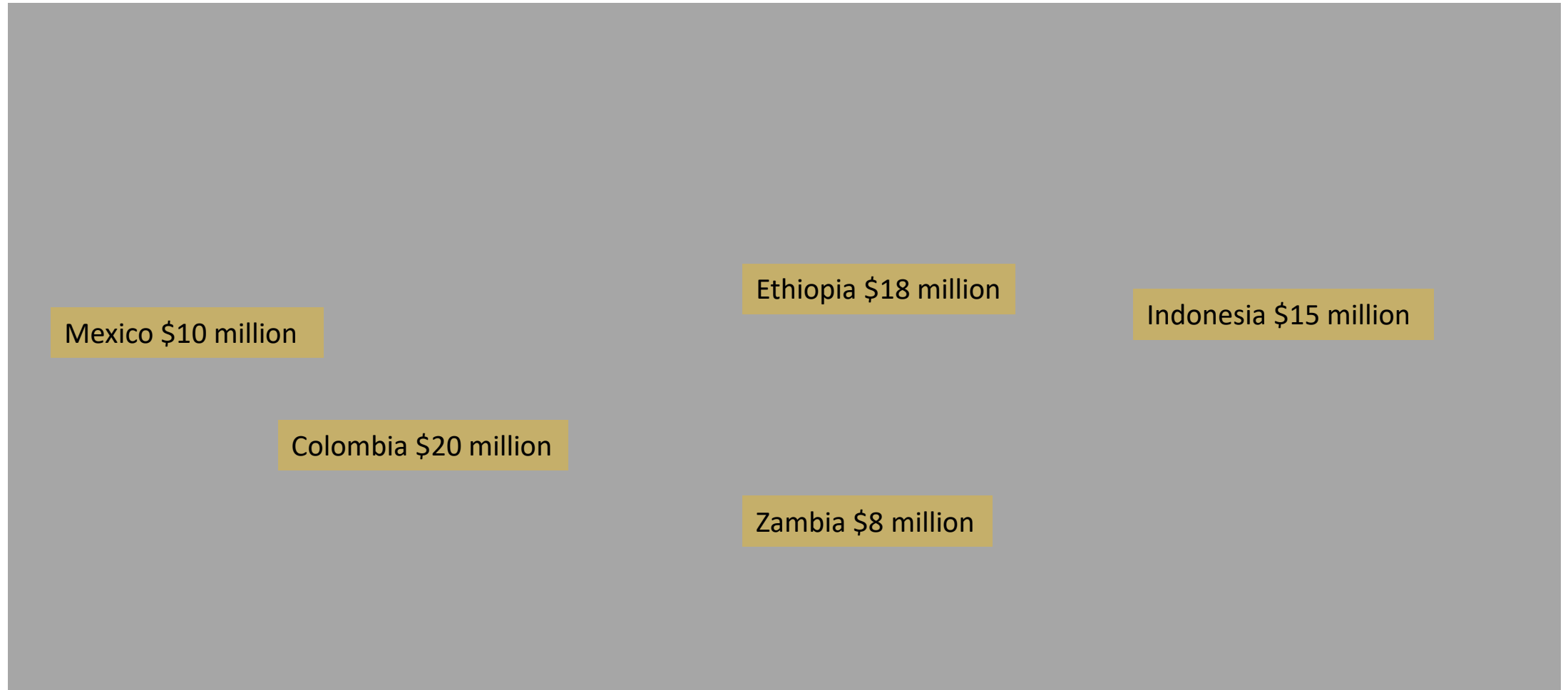




# BioCarbon Fund Initiative for Sustainable Forest Landscapes ISFL

- ISFL is a World Bank-implemented, donor-supported initiative in the World Bank Climate Change group established in 2013
  - Contributing participants: **Germany, Norway, Switzerland, UK (DEFRA & BEIS), USA**
  - \$360 million in fund capital
  - Programs in **Colombia, Ethiopia, Indonesia, Mexico, and Zambia**
- Supports sustainable landscapes, climate-smart land use, and green supply chains
  - Catalyzes the development of a low-carbon rural economy promoting livelihood opportunities for communities
- The ISFL approach to improving sustainable land use-related to GHG emissions:
  - Operating at jurisdictional scale
  - Leveraging partnerships
  - Incentivizing results
  - Building on experience

- ❑ There will be decision made if there going to be a new program supporting IPs and LCs engagement in ER programs under the FCPF/Carbon Fund
